Meet at 9AM at the Fee Demo Box, and we will walk together 525 feet down the River Trail to the first climber's access side trail.

The official Adopt-A-Crag Event should conclude by noon giving time for lunch and a little top rope climbing and rappelling practice courtesy of TraditionalMountaineering .org.

Options for the afternoon include a visit to the nearby Deschutes Brewery on Cascades Lakes Highway for beer tasting and a tour of the plant.
